

## **Code of Ethics**

Every Applicant must agree to the Code of Ethics. Failure to abide by these rules may result in expulsion from the Society.

1. All archaeological field collection, excavation, survey and laboratory work will be conducted under the supervision of a professional archaeologist.
2. All laws relating to archaeological, historical, prehistoric cultural and environmental resources must be observed and adhered to by SAS members.
3. A permanent artifact repository must be obtained and approved before any archaeological work can commence.
4. All artifacts and all other materials recovered during an SAS activity must be deposited at the approved repository.
5. The private purchase, sale, trade or collection of protected archaeological materials by individuals is prohibited.
6. All activities under the auspices of SAS (excavation, workshops, lectures, laboratory work, surveys, etc.) must be approved by the Board of Directors of SAS.
